

DOE MOUNTAIN IMPROVED FOREST MANAGEMENT, USA



CREATING A BETTER MORE SUSTAINABLE FOREST IN THE SOUTHERN BLUE RIDGE REGION

The Doe Mountain project consists of over 8,600 acres of forest in the north eastern corner of Tennessee, making it one of the largest remaining blocks of privately-owned forest in the Southern Blue Ridge region.

With support from the state of Tennessee, Doe Mountain was purchased to create a better and more sustainable forest that can support healthy wildlife and be enjoyed by recreationists for many years to come. Over its lifetime, this project will sequester 38,000 tonnes CO₂e annually.

Doe Mountain Recreation Authority oversees the recreational access for the public and helps steward the land. Recreational opportunities in the project area include hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding, and low-impact ATV Touring.

The management plan and guidance under the Doe Mountain Recreation Authority board is designed to preserve the habitat while also stimulating recreation based tourism in an economically depressed region.

Improved forestry management plays a vital role in protecting freshwater systems like Doe Mountain. The forests around the river act as natural water filters and purify the water for all who use it

15 LIFE ON LAND



The Doe Mountain project provides a sustainable and protected habitat for 40 rare, threatened, and endangered plant and animal species. The protected acres are also home to oak-hickory, cove forests and oak-pine trees as well as healthy populations of deer, turkey, and black bears

WHAT THE CARBON FINANCE DELIVERS

The carbon finance for this project funds the conservation activities to ensure the forests remain protected. Without carbon finance, alternative sources of income could be silvicultural practices or sale for intensive management or development.
